

Daily Screenings:

- Please screen your children daily before they leave the house. Any child with a temperature of 100.4 or any other COVID -19 like symptoms may not participate in our program and may return only after a negative PCR Nasal Swab test, clearance from their doctor and in accordance with NJDOH guidelines. We will call to follow-up and review next steps with you.
- Daily temperatures of all participants and staff will be taken upon their arrival at our campus. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 or higher will not be permitted to stay.
- While children are not on campus, we ask families to follow the latest health and governmental guidance designed to mitigate exposure to COVID-19, including social distancing and wearing masks. Families are also encouraged to particularly minimize contact between children and anyone considered to be medically vulnerable under NJDOH guidelines. All families will be relying on each other's compliance for the safety of all participants and staff, as well as their family members.
- Guidelines may evolve based on updates from NJDOH.

Participant Drop off and Pickup:

- On days we begin at 10:00AM, please drop off your children between 9:45AM – 10:15AM and pick them up between 4:00PM – 4:30PM, based on pre-assigned driving lanes and times.
- On days we begin at 2:00PM, please drop off your children between 1:45PM – 2:15PM and pick them up between 8:30PM – 9:00PM, based on pre-assigned driving lanes and times.
- Please be sure to use only your pre-assigned lanes and arrive during pre-assigned times.
- Whomever is dropping off children may not leave until temperatures of all children in that vehicle have been taken.
- Drivers may NOT exit their vehicles when dropping off or picking up.

Face Mask Protocol:

- If participants are transported to the JKHA Summer campus in a vehicle containing people from more than one household, all persons in such vehicles should wear a mask for the duration of their trip both to and from the campus.
- Participants and Bunk staff generally will not be required to wear masks on a typical camp day, either when outdoors or indoors. However, there may be times when participants and/or Bunk staff are instructed to wear a mask and they will be required to comply with such instructions.
- Adult staff and specialists will only be required to wear masks when not able to be socially distanced from Bunks or Neighborhoods.
- Guidelines may evolve based on updates from NJDOH

Handwashing and Proper Hygiene Practices:

- Handwashing stations or hand sanitizers will be available throughout the premises.

- Staff will be instructed to supervise those under their care to ensure proper handwashing procedures using EPA soaps and/or hand sanitizer throughout the day.
- We will be reinforcing safe coughing and sneezing practices.

Cleaning and Disinfecting:

- Our cleaning team will thoroughly clean and disinfect program areas and equipment daily, with special care given to bathrooms and door handles.
- Bathrooms will be cleaned every hour over the course of our program day.
- Guidelines may evolve based on updates from NJDOH

Camp Medical Facilities:

We will have 2 separate Health Center locations manned by our staff: 1) Specific to physically ill campers complaining of headaches, fever, etc. 2) Specific to cuts, bruises, scrapes, etc.

Drinking Water:

- Water fountains will not be available for direct use.
- Water stations will be set up throughout the campus. Staff, wearing disposable gloves, will assist in filling water bottles when touchless dispensers are not available.
- **Please send a reusable water bottle with your child's name firmly affixed to it**

Group Sizes:

- Group sizes will be based on NJDOH guidelines and may evolve accordingly.
- Friend requests will be honored to the best of our abilities but are not guaranteed.
- Each group will be referred to as a "Bunk." Up to (2) Bunks may combine to form a "Neighborhood" when appropriate.
- Activities will primarily be scheduled by Bunk.
- Social distancing will be maintained when called for based on NJDOH guidelines.

Visitors:

- There will strictly be no visitors permitted while JKHA Summer is in session.

Staff Training:

As part of staff training and orientation, all staff members will be trained in the following areas:

- COVID -19 symptoms and what to do if they suspect a camper is ill
- What social distancing means at JKHA Summer
- Proper hygiene practices for themselves and participants
- Monitoring mental and emotional health of participants
- Monitoring their own health

- Speaking with campers about COVID -19

If a Participant or Staff Member Develops COVID -19 Like Symptoms While at Camp:

- Participants or staff members will be sent to the Health Center to be evaluated and monitored while waiting for pickup. Please be available to pick up within 1.5 hours from hearing from us.
- If a participant or staff member has been sent home with COVID -19 like symptoms, they must be taken for a PCR Nasal Swab test on that day. They may return to camp only after a negative test result, written clearance from their doctor and in accordance with NJDOH guidelines.
- We will call to follow-up and review next steps in each individual circumstance, based on the most recent NJDOH guidelines offered at that time.

If There is a COVID -19 Diagnosis of a Participant, Staff Member or Any Member of Their Household:

- It is our expectation that you will notify us immediately if your child or any other member of your household tests positive for COVID -19. Rest assured that we will maintain appropriate confidentiality of the individual at all times while mitigating the situation.
- JKHA Summer will follow guidelines set forth by the NJDOH for contact tracing. Children and staff members of that individual's bunk and, if required, neighborhood, will be sent home and informed of when they must undergo a PCR Nasal Swab test. Do NOT have your child tested until we have instructed you to do so – timing of the test is a critical step to follow as it pertains to infection incubation periods.
- A participant or staff member will need to remain at home for 14 days from the COVID -19 diagnosis and may return to camp only after 2 negative tests, an additional 24 hours and written clearance from their doctor.
